

Newest Equipment Additions



Kitamura Mycenter HX400iSII

Quality and durability take on a new meaning with the addition of the newest horizontal machining center in the CNC department. Known as a 'workhorse', the Kitamura Mycenter HX400iSII expands our capabilities by providing more flexibility with both high and low volume projects.

It is equipped with leading edge CNC machine tool technology which optimizes each process. High accuracy and repeatability during machining is provided by the solid box way construction. Across the board, it is an investment that will provide high quality parts with a faster turn-around.

CWM's Quality Department recently installed a Sheffield Pioneer 8.10.6 CMM machine. The new equipment paved the way to acquiring the latest in sophisticated software technology— PC-DMIS Cad++ . The software integrates directly with a CAD model, allowing for inspection programming prior to having the product sample available. This greatly reduces the lead time to provide a first

article inspection report.



QA inspects a part using the new PC-DMIS CAD++ software.

Complex parts can be measured with extreme accuracy and done very quickly. Plus, operator error is minimized by the use of the CAD model. According to Ramón Muñoz, Quality Technician, "We are very excited and eager to learn and execute the many capabilities of this new CMM and software." We couldn't agree more!
