He starts with each die casting department, then to the STRIKO furnace, shipping and receiving, CNC and conventional machining area, assembly area, maintenance, and tool rooms. Israel's keen eye is trained to detect potential hazards lurking in the corners amidst the machinery. He promptly marks these spots for immediate attention, preventing accidents before they have a chance to occur.


CWM Gives Back: Toys for Tots
